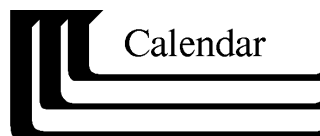


VISION 2001-SEEDS OF CHANGE

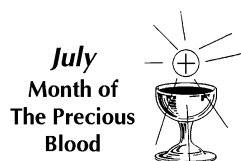
