Last Sunday, I was able to attend the ordination ceremony for the transitional deacons at St. John's Cathedral. These transitional deacons will be ordained to the priesthood next May. It was a very beautiful and inspiring ceremony. There were people from all over the diocese there to pray for, and support, these five young men in their vocation to the priesthood. The Hail Mary that we kneel and pray after every Mass in our parish is for more vocations to the ordained and consecrated life. Our prayers and our efforts to encourage more of our young people to respond generously to God's call are very important.

Please keep these newly ordained deacons in your prayers that will strengthen their resolve to follow Him faithfully in their vocation and bless their ministry as deacons and their final preparation for ordination to the priesthood.

November is a month during which we pray in a special way for all those who have died. Please look at the Book of the Dead in the chapel, which contains all the names submitted on the All Souls Day envelopes this year. Pray for these and all the faithful departed that they may rest soon in the peace of Christ.

Death is not something we like to think about too much and yet it is something that we will all experience some day. Our Lord urges us to always be prepared for we know neither the day nor the hour when He will call us. We prepare ourselves best by striving to live a life in the imitation of Jesus; listening to His words and putting them into practice in our daily lives. This includes, of course, frequent Communion, frequent confession, and daily prayer.

It also may do us some good to reflect on the funeral rites of the Church and how important it is that we understand the meaning of these rites and do not consider them a burden, or a bother. We may hear our elderly parents or grandparents saying that they don't want anyone to bother with a big funeral and all the other arrangements. The most important part of the funeral rite is, of course, the Mass itself. It is very important that the body of one who lies in death should be brought to the church for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The Mass is the best prayer that we can offer for our loved ones who have died. If cremation is to take place, it should take place after the funeral Mass and the ashes should be properly buried. We should never allow the ashes of our loved ones to be scattered even if this is what "grandpa" wanted. Our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit and should be treated so in life and in death. The only reason a person should be cremated is for financial reasons. That is why the Church permits it in the first place. Next week, I will have a few words about the Funeral Mass itself and how we might better plan one according to the provisions of the Church and not just our personal likes and desires.

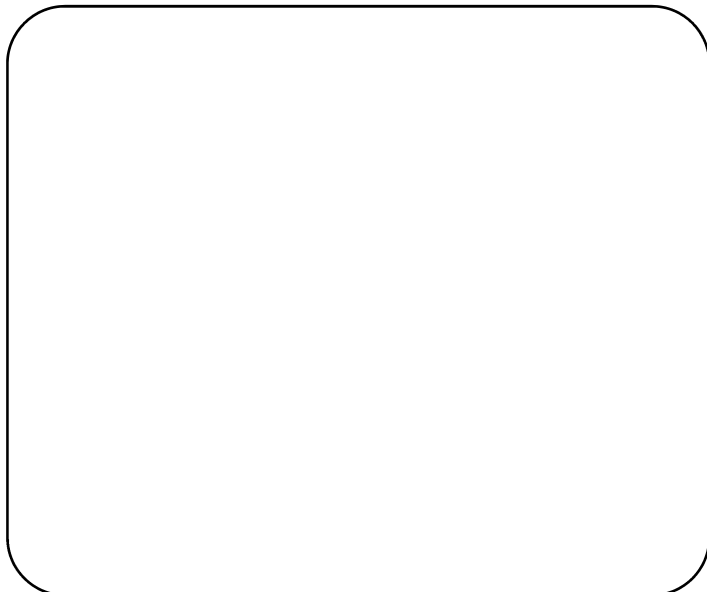

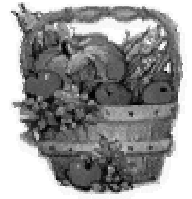
